

at the Hargeisa Cultural Centre. In his speech he emphasized the need for solidarity hence reminded the audience that Somaliland was a nation that boasted democratic processes and tradition which is only realised through unity and togetherness.

He cautioned that when such togetherness is ruffled, much is stood to be lost.

He however noted that there was much goodness realized in uniting a people.

He said that vast achievements and benefits reaped through togetherness than when a people are divided.

The VP pointed out that it was a year of elections, despite having been post-ponded, hence there is even more need in maintaining and safeguarding the prevalent solidarity. He said that it was an honour for the country to host the exhibition and hailed the efforts of the head of the centre Mr. Jama Musa Jama for his constant efforts and in putting the country in a global map.

The fair which has this year's theme is "Togetherness", and Tunisia is a guest nation had its opening graced by the attendance of international participants, eminent personalities from the various councils of the government, diplomats that include those of resident embassies, a horde of artistes and numerous notable personalities.

It is worth noting that each year the fair has a partner country as it hosts the expo, with this time round being Tunisia.

The event is expected to be held for five days and would have in its itinerary 123 speakers, 35 panels and 3 children's sessions, 24 new Books (Somali), 22 performance artistes, 16 paint artists, 10 diplomats, 1 circus and 1 Chess and a tradition African "Shax" competition.

In a speech delivered by the Vice President, he said that it is aa great honour for Somaliland to host the International Book Fair successfully perennially for almost the past two decades.

"We thank the cultural centre and its chairman, Jama, and the workers for the hard work they have been doing for 17 years, and they started from scratch, they are very grateful"

"It is a great honour for us that every year different countries come to this forum to exchange knowledge and learn a lot from us, and we learn from them", he said.

He continued, "This year's theme is togetherness, its value has been widely explained, and today there is a great need for the country and people to be together", and added, "Togetherness is doing a lot in our country and the world where there are many challenges, and togetherness can overcome challenges be they, climate change, drought, education, health, access to clean water or associated issues". He advised the populaces to shun tribalism and to think of themselves as constituents.

"If we don't unite, the biggest thing will be the collapse of our security, we are proud of being a democratic nation, let's not undermine it", he concluded.

In stark contrast to Somalia, Somaliland has successfully conducted one-person, one-vote elections since 2001, including a public referendum for the national constitution. Since then, the country has held seven additional elections, comprising three presidential elections, two parliamentary elections, and three local council elections.

Since 2002, the upcoming elections on November 13 will mark the ninth instance of elections and the third occurrence of simultaneous presidential and parliamentary elections in a country often recognized as an established democracy and a beacon of stability and democratic values, not only within the Horn of Africa but across the entire continent albeit remaining poorly rewarded by an international community which appears to favor 'rump' Somalia to the south – as a

U.S. former diplomat calls it. Last week, the Commission assured voters that the NEC was fully prepared for the November 13 elections and did not foresee any issues that would hinder the process, given its active communication with all stakeholders.

We are currently preparing all necessary equipment and ballot boxes for the election and making excellent progress. Additionally, training, awareness campaigns, and regional and district staff recruitment will begin shortly. The NEC has received a budget of \$7.5 million for the election thus far. Along with the government, NEC have developed a detailed plan for the disbursement of the remaining funds. The NEC is also in discussions with international donors regarding their potential financial contributions to the election budget", a statement the electoral body released said.

In the statement, the Somaliland National Electoral Commission (NEC) clarified that in the upcoming elections, the Biometric Voter Verification System (BVVS) will be employed to verify voters before they cast their ballots. This system, a pioneering technological breakthrough, is utilized by only a select few countries worldwide. Currently, the government is the sole contributor to the available election budget.

"We urge the international community to take immediate steps to address this crisis and prevent further destabilization of the region," according to a statement by the Somaliland Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued on Tuesday.

Somaliland's concern followed the news earlier this week that local militias seized two truckloads of weapons from government forces in the village of Shiilamaow, about 20 kilometers northwest of Abudwak town, close to the Ethiopian border, according to a report by the VOA, which also stated the weapons included "DshK and PKM machine guns, AK-47 assault rifles, pistols, and ammunition."

Somalia's Internal Security Ministry admitted the incident and said the



weapons were initially seized by government security forces from "illegal weapons traders" and were being escorted when local armed militias erected a checkpoint and intercepted the weapons.

citing a local official as saying, the news stated that "the local militias overpowered government forces after receiving reinforcements from clansmen." The incident resulted in the death of 12 people, including two soldiers.

"The Government of the Republic of Somaliland expresses grave concern over the alarming escalation of arms proliferation in Somalia, as evidenced by recent events. In the past three months, Al-Shabaab has successfully seized substantial quantities of weaponry from government forces in central Somalia. Moreover, the recent incident in Aabud Waq, where civilians and clan militias captured a large cache of weapons and ammunition from the Mogadishu government, further highlights the critical security situation," Somaliland said.

Ethiopia was among the countries that advocated for the lifting of the three-decades arms embargo. Following a two-day official visit in September 2023 to Addis Abeba by Somalia's President Hassan Sheikh Mohamud, Ethiopia officially joined Somalia and other countries and called upon the UN Security Council (UNSC) "to consider the request of the Federal Governments of Somalia for the lifting of the arms embargo imposed on the country for more than 30 years."

The UN Security Council (UNSC) subsequently lifted the arms embargo on Somalia in December of the same year after 31 years. Somalia welcomed the decision and said it would enable its security forces to effectively tackle security threats including from Al-Shabaab militants.

However, Somaliland had objected to the decision from the get go, and once again repeated its position in the statement on Tuesday. "The subsequent proliferation of these captured arms, now widely documented on social media. raises serious questions about the wisdom and timing of this decision," Somaliland said. Adis Standard

The command of the National Army has cautioned of fake news being circulated about Somaliland servicemen presently undergoing training in Ethiopia have had mishaps befall hence sternly warned those behind the allegations to desist from it immediately.

The military headquarters not only scoffed at and retorted to the allegations but warned the culprits that stern action would be taken against those peddling the lies.

The members of the public have also been assured by the strength of a press release that all the service men in training are safe and sound and that the claims were a mere flimsy and baseless lies being peddled.

A statement from the National Armed Forces press office circulated to the media on Friday read as "follows:

The command of the Somaliland National Army assures all the people of Somaliland that there is nothing true about the news concerning the Somaliland servicemen who are undergoing military training Ethiopia, hence they are safely and soundly undertaking their training programmes.

"The command of the National Army is warning all people who spread lies and wrong information about the National Army to refrain from it forthwith; otherwise, they will be subjected to legal actions taken against them". END.

The statement from the military headquarters follows the fake news and propaganda spread and peddled in the social media claiming that the Somaliland servicemen currently undergoing military training in Ethiopia has had mishaps fallen upon them.

Central Bank leads operation ridding frontier town of illegal money changers in bid to maintain rates stability

Illegal money changers have been rounded up in Tog-wajaale town in a clean-up operation campaign led by the Central Bank at the end of the week in efforts to cushion exchange rates stability.

In a bid to rogue out illegal money changers at the vibrant frontier town, the exercises le by none other than the Director of the Central Bank himself Mr. Mohamed Qasim Hussein Dalmar, around seventy unlicensed money changers were rounded up an had their operations curtailed and their tools of the trade and working facilities confiscated. The administration of Tog-Wajale district and all the area security agencies participated in the operation meant to curb disruptions of the main exchange rates hence curtail scamming which spikes them.

The DG reminded the people that the Central Bank's rules guiding the regulations of exchange rates ought to be adhered hence the stakeholders in the business have

to be registered and licensed.

He gave a stern warning to operators who flout the law that action would be taken against them swiftly.

He reveled that those they rounded up hence found to have flouted the regulations number 70. Given that Wajaale is a border town and the main gateway to Ethiopia cherishing vibrancy in the commercial sector, it was precarious and a soft spot to disrupt the exchange rates since there was a myriad of money changers.

transfer to empower farmers and promote sustainable agricultural practices. The strategy plan outlines a clear roadmap for the next three years (2025-2027), with specific activities, timelines, and responsible



Growing with prominence in the Horn of Africa and Beyond as a yearly cultural festival, the Redsea Cultural Foundation, through its Hargeysa Cultural Centre, once again is organizing the most vibrant festival for the 17th time this year at Hargeysa, Somaliland. The Hargeysa International Book Fair (HIBF), which started as a reading and writing culture promotion in a nation that is recovering from a civil war, is now an iconic platform beyond books and reading promotion. Effective in addressing its founding mission, responding to the fear of losing Somali art and cultural expressions such as poetry and theatre due to the destruction that forced the community to refuge, including the leading artists, it has year after year set the boundaries and firmly created a community of art and knowledge production. Its sister institutions, the Berbera Cultural Centre, the Somaliland Centre for African Studies, and the publishing arm all collaborate to make the festival a melting pot of academic, literary, entertainment, and diplomatic relations.

With youth and women at its epicentre, and because of the country's political situation (i.e. unrecognized), it turned out to be the flagship interface for the international community to connect to Somaliland and vice versa. It became an open window for the young to engage with the world and for the international community to engage with Somaliland people when political restrictions do not allow direct engagement with the government. This has significantly shaped so many people's identification of Somaliland with the Book Festival and the Cultural Centre, and vice versa. The consistency in hosting the fair with an ever-increasing number is a testimony to the call to have the festival, which was a well-tough action. The community it has created is beyond 70,000, bringing together global, regional, local, and diaspora communities. Accordingly, the 17th anniversary of the annual Hargeysa International Book Fair will be held from the 20th to 275h of July in Hargeysa, Somaliland. The year's theme is Togetherness, and the Guest country is Tunisia. The first fair had

the theme of Freedom in 2008, followed by censorship in 2009. The remaining themes up to now included Citizenship (2010), Collective Memory (2011), Visualizing the future (2012), Journey (2013), Imagination (2014) Spaces, (2015), Leadership & Creativity (2016),

Wisdom (2017), Connectivity, (2018) Coexistence, (2019), COVID19, (2020), Neighborhood, (2021), Solidarity for 2022, Resilience in 2023. Over the years, we have welcomed Nigeria, Ghana, Malawi, Djibouti, Kenya, South Africa, Rwanda, Egypt, and Ethiopia, Senegal, and the last Guest Country was Morocco in 2023.
