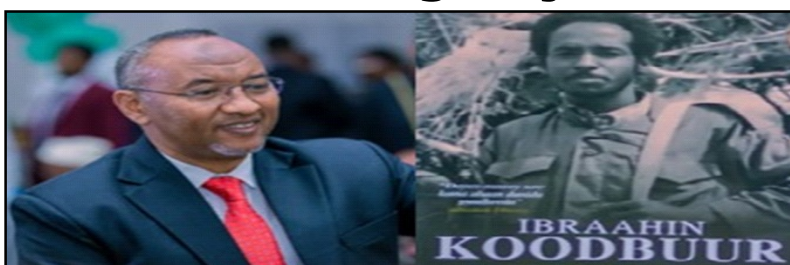

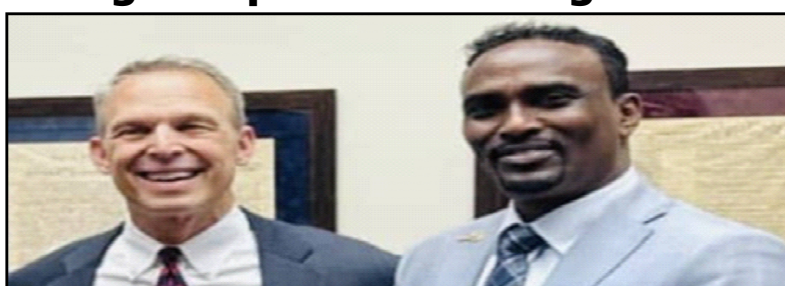

Somaliland President Extends.....

In a statement issued through his spokesman, Hussein Adan Igeh (Deyr), President Abdillahi addressed Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar, and the Indian nation, emphasizing the deep historical ties between Somaliland and India. “The Republic of Somaliland and India are bound by over 300 years of shared history—ties forged through maritime trade, cultural exchange, and mutual respect,” the statement read. “In this hour of sorrow, we stand in steadfast solidarity with our Indian friends.” President Abdillahi’s message concluded with prayers for the victims and their families: “May the victims rest in eternal peace, and may solace be granted to all those affected by this profound national tragedy.” The Somaliland government has reiterated its



commitment to supporting India during this period of mourning, reflecting the enduring bond between the two regions. Indian authorities, including Prime Minister Modi, who described the incident as “heartbreaking beyond words,” have mobilized extensive rescue and relief operations. The U.S. National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) and the UK’s Air Accidents Investigation Branch (AAIB) have offered assistance in investigating the crash, the cause of which remains under scrutiny. The tragic incident, which occurred on Thursday, June 12, 2025, involved Air India Flight AI171, a Boeing 787 Dreamliner carrying 242 passengers and crew, bound for London. The plane crashed shortly after takeoff from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport.

14th June, 2025. This development marks a pivotal move by the Somaliland government to strengthen transparency and efficiency in public resource management, setting a precedent for improved governance in the region.

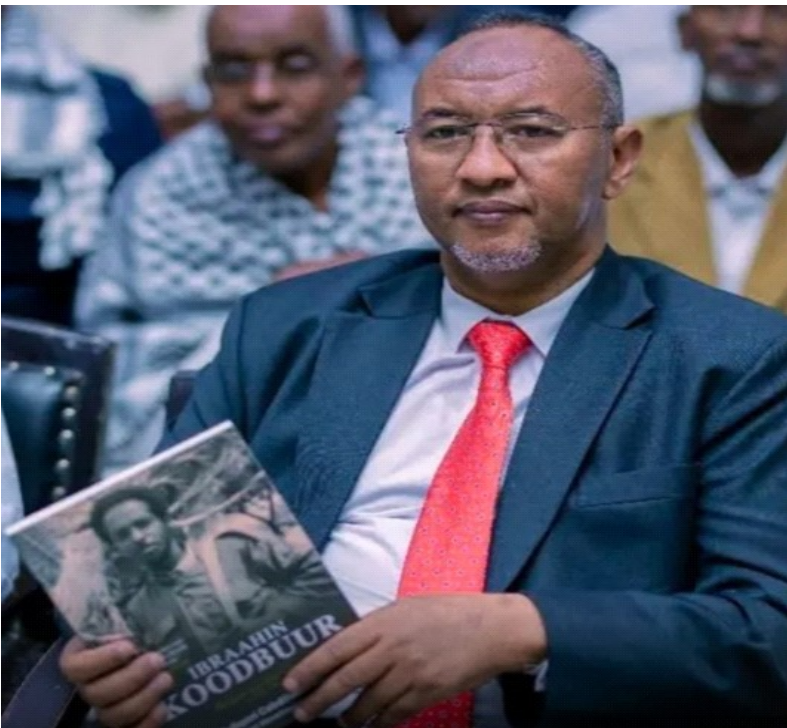

Somalia’s meritless claims over Somaliland hinder the United States’ ability to forge deeper diplomatic ties with Somaliland, a responsible partner nation that maintains internal order, conducts democratic elections, and actively counters piracy and extremism.

“Somaliland has established itself as a stable, democratic, and reliable



partner in East Africa. As China expands its influence across the globe, strengthening our alliances with free nations like Somaliland is more important than ever,” said Congressman Andy Ogles (TN-05). “I support the people of Somaliland in their pursuit of independence and look forward to building a strong partnership with them as allies.”

(H.R. 10402), a groundbreaking legislative proposal aimed at formally recognizing Somaliland as an independent nation. The bill, introduced on June 12, 2025, marks a significant milestone in Somaliland’s 34-year quest for international recognition, highlighting its stability, democratic governance, and strategic importance in the Horn of Africa.

According to a statement from the Somaliland National News Agency (SOLNA), Somaliland’s Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, Hon. Abdirahman Daahir Aadan, praised Congressman Perry for his bold and visionary leadership. “This legislative initiative is a historic step forward,” the minister stated, commending Perry’s courage in championing Somaliland’s cause.

“We deeply appreciate his efforts to advance a bill that acknowledges Somaliland’s sovereignty and its role as a beacon of peace and democracy in a volatile region.”

The minister recently met with

Congressman Perry in the United States to discuss accelerating support for Somaliland’s recognition. These discussions underscored the potential for strengthened U.S.-Somaliland ties, particularly in counterterrorism, trade, and regional stability, given Somaliland’s strategic location along the Gulf of Aden.

The bill proposes a shift in U.S. foreign policy to foster cooperation with Somaliland, a self-governing nation that has maintained peace and democratic elections since declaring independence from Somalia in 1991. As the “Somaliland Independence Act” moves through the US, Congress, it could redefine U.S. foreign policy in the Horn of Africa, potentially making Somaliland the first nation to gain formal U.S. recognition as an independent state.

A high-level Somaliland delegation, led by Justice Minister Yoonis Axmed Yoonis and Youth and Sports Minister Axmed Yasin Mohamed, held a productive meeting with the second Deputy and acting Speaker of the Swedish Parliament, Ms. Julia Kronlid, during a working visit to Sweden. The discussions focused on deepening the longstanding bilateral relationship between Somaliland and Sweden, with an emphasis on cooperation in justice, prison reform, human rights, youth development, and sports. The

meeting marked a significant step in fostering closer ties between the two nations. Both sides expressed a commitment to advancing mutual interests, with Somaliland seeking to showcase its progress in governance and statehood. A key outcome of the talks was an agreement for Swedish parliamentarians to visit Somaliland to observe its democratic institutions and realities on the ground firsthand. The delegation also urged Sweden to advocate for Somaliland's

recognition within the European Union, highlighting the country's stability and democratic achievements. This visit is seen as a pivotal moment in Somaliland's ongoing efforts to gain international recognition and strengthen its global partnerships. Hon. Sakariye Hassan Wa'ays, the Somaliland representative in Sweden, who participated in the delegation's meeting with the parliament, welcomed the delegation in Stockholm.

UK Representative Meets Somaliland MP.....

Louise Hancock, the UK Representative in Somaliland, held a key meeting today with MP Barkhad Batuun to discuss the political empowerment of the Gabooye minority community ahead of the 2026 Parliamentary and Local Council Elections. The discussions focused on increasing the representation of the Gabooye, a historically marginalized group known for their limited access to education, economic resources, and political power, as highlighted by the European Union Agency for Asylum (EUAA). The meeting comes at a critical juncture as Somaliland prepares for its upcoming elections, aligning with broader regional shifts toward democratic reforms. Hancock emphasized the importance of ensuring the Gabooye community's voice in the political process, stating on X, "We discussed a range of issues concerning the minority community he represents, including increasing their political representation." Batuun, a vocal advocate for the Gabooye, shared images of the meeting, noting discussions on development projects, security, and the community's participation in the elections. This engagement marks a potential turning point for the Gabooye, who have long faced side-



lined under Somaliland's clan-based political system. As Somaliland navigates this transitional period, the international community, including the UK, appears poised to support inclusive

governance. Stakeholders will watch closely to see if the 2026 elections mark a new era for the Gabooye and other marginalized groups—or if entrenched interests will prevail.

Ramadan Academy Celebrates Third Graduates with Grand Ceremony in Somaliland

During the 34th Independence Restoration Celebration event in Washington DC, Pierre Tozzi, Staff Director of the Congressional-Executive Commission on China, delivered a compelling address that positioned Somaliland as a beacon of democracy not only for Africa but for the world. Tozzi's remarks, emphasized the parallels between Somaliland and Taiwan, both of which exemplify democratic resilience despite lacking widespread international recognition. Tozzi recounted a symposium held last summer in Taipei, co-organized with Mohamed Haggi, former representative to Taiwan, and Taiwan's Ambassador to Somaliland, Lieu. The event critically examined China's governance model in Africa, with one panel discussing how China entraps nations in debt, corrupts governance, and imposes its authoritarian and totalitarian systems. In contrast, another panel explored the alternative democratic models being built by Somaliland and Taiwan, highlighting their potential as counterexamples to China's influence. Reflecting on his experiences in the Horn of Africa, Tozzi described a stark contrast between his visits to Mogadishu, Somalia, and Hargeisa, Somaliland. In Mogadishu, the environment was marked by instability, requiring security measures such as sleeping in bunkers and wearing bulletproof jackets. However, upon arriving in Hargeisa, Tozzi witnessed a vibrant celebration of democracy that deeply moved him and his team, showcasing Somaliland's stability and democratic spirit. Tozzi argued



that the United States recognizes the strategic location and geography of Somaliland, making a strong case for its international recognition. Yet, he asserted that the most compelling argument for recognition is moral: Somaliland's status as a democracy. He expressed optimism that, with the support of the United States and Democratic Taiwan, Somaliland could serve as a powerful example for Africa and the global community, inspiring other nations to embrace democratic governance. The event, attended by distinguished guests including Somaliland Foreign Minister Abdirahman Adam, Somaliland USA Envoy Bashir Goth, and other friends of Somaliland from the United States and the Somaliland diaspora who participated, reinforced the growing ties between Somaliland and Taiwan, both of which continue to navigate complex international landscapes while upholding democratic principles. As discussions about the future of unrecognized states and the role of democracy in global politics persist, Somaliland's journey remains a significant narrative for advocates of stability and international cooperation.

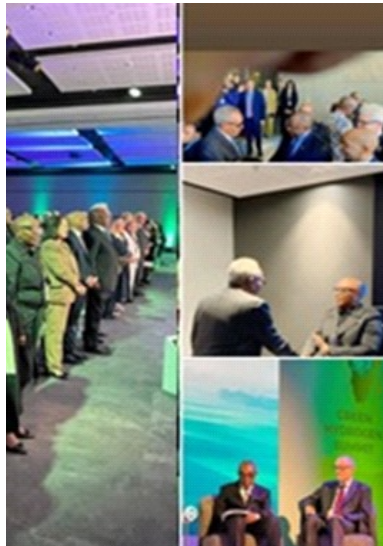

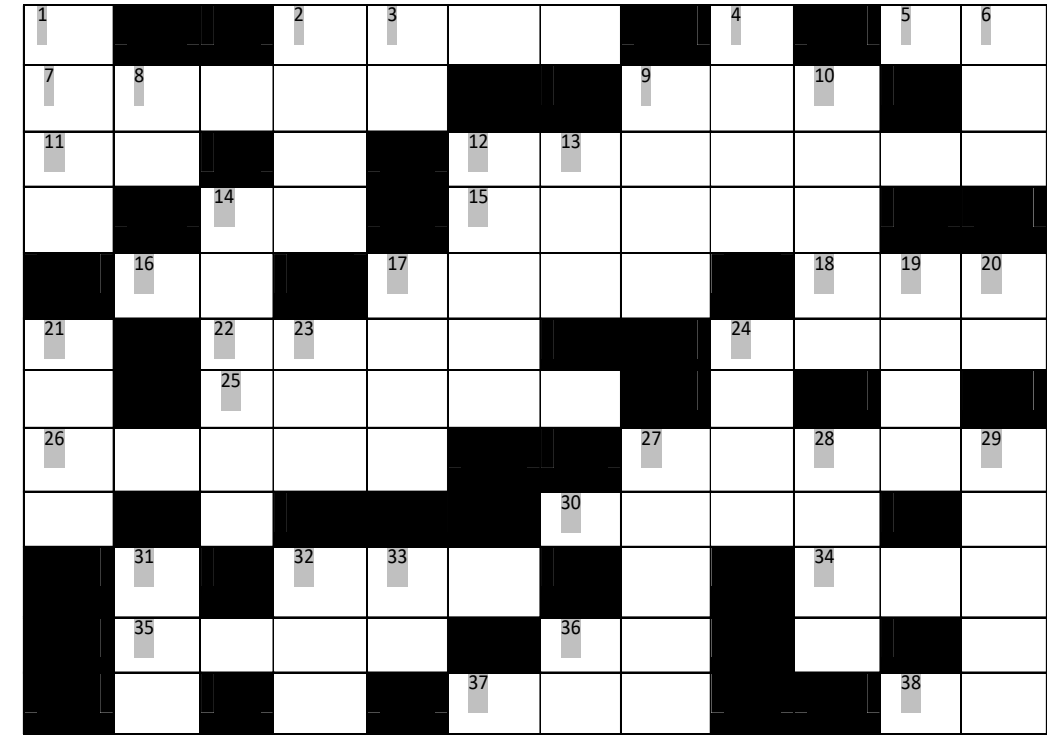
Somaliland Deputy Minister Champions Green Energy at Global Summit in South Africa

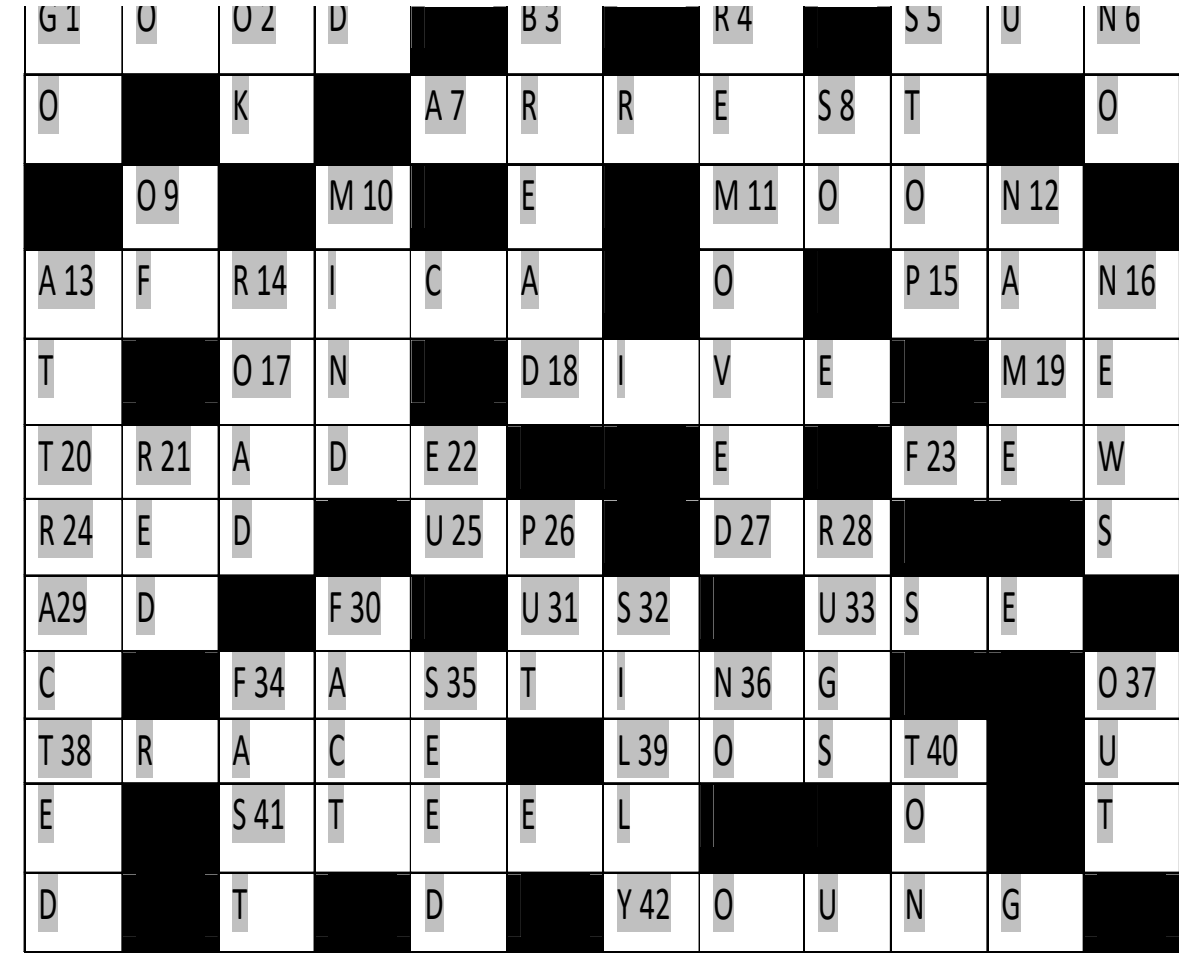
